
The Balanced Man Program is the centerpiece of the SigEp chapter experience and provides the lessons that today's student needs to be successful during and after college. The BMP offers an experience focused on scholarship, leadership, professional development and life skills.

What Are Colorado Gamma Requirements for Membership?

Academic Standards

The minimum high school grade point average for incoming freshman to be eligible for membership shall be a 3.0 out of a 4.0 scale (or its equivalent). The minimum college grade point average for continuing college students to be eligible for membership shall be a 2.8 cumulative GPA.

The Chapter GPA for Spring 2020 was 3.39, the all-campus average GPA was 3.31. The Chapter ranked 6th of 23 IFC fraternities.



Any existing member who does not meet this requirement is on academic restrictions and shall not be permitted to be an officer of the undergraduate chapter or a committee chairman. During this period, he shall be required to meet with the chapter's Chaplain and Faculty Advisor Dr. Todd Donavan to develop an academic support plan to improve his academic performance. He must also obtain an academic mentor approved by the chapter's Chaplain and meet with his academic mentor regularly to review his progress.

Live-In Requirement

As a part of their brotherhood obligations, every member (except Seniors) are required to live in the house until such time as the house is full. The only exception is for those who join in the spring semester after formal rush has ended, as part of our year-round rush program, and have other housing arrangements in place. The exception must be approved by the AVC prior to excepting joining.



CSU/SigEp chapter facilities have been a substance-free since 2001. Potential New Members need to want to live in a substance-free fraternity house.



It is our membership's desire that the house be clean, quiet and well-maintained. So, brothers can focus on their lives as students and enjoy the company of one another without having to worry about whether they'll be able to study or sleep over the noise and distraction of parties. By moving social events out of our homes and into third-party venues, our brothers can more effectively use common spaces for studying, conducting Balanced Man Program challenge meetings and hosting other events that will help attract and retain the kind of members and volunteers we are looking to engage.

Substances are defined to include alcohol, marijuana, tobacco, and other smoking materials including vaping, as well as illicit and illegal drugs.

Membership Requires Involvement

Each member of Sigma Phi Epsilon understands their personal responsibility to live up to and support the philosophical tenets of the Balanced Man Program.

Each member will participate in each of the Sigma, Phi, Epsilon and Brother Mentor Challenges. Members who do not complete their challenge within the maximum time frame face expulsion from the chapter for failure to meet the Fraternity's development expectations.



Each member will participate in philanthropy, community service and service learning – All members of Sigma Phi Epsilon have joined an organization committed to giving back to the community. Members are required to participate in numerous volunteer events, such as our philanthropy events and university programs, to give back to the Fort Collins community.

Each member understands there is no place for hazing or unequal treatment of new members. It is each member's responsibility to ensure a safe and healthy, values-based experience. Any member found in violation of this expectation may be subject to full penalties of the Fraternity, his college or university, and the law.

Each member agrees to support and behave consistently with SigEp's Risk Management Policies. Violation of these policies subjects a brother to fines, suspension or expulsion as defined by the Bylaws as well as a potential loss of general liability



What Does the SigEp Experience Look Like?

Scholarship

Sigma Phi Epsilon has high expectations for academic performance. The primary purpose for fraternity involvement is to get the most out of one's educational opportunities. C get maintains a minimum GPA requirement for all members and encourages all members to excel in the classroom.

Sigma Phi Epsilon has the highest GPA of any national paternity and Colorado Gamma is consistently among the top authorities at CSU with an overall grade point average greater than 3.0

Academic success is rewarded at Colorado Gamma. Are Penn and scroll society recognizes all members who maintain a 3.5 GPA and above.



New members can receive tutoring from older members as well as advice on choosing classes, professors, etc. We realize that maintaining, assistance, and encouragement produces better results on an academic level. When attends college to attain an education and we have not forgotten this purpose.

Q: Are fraternities expensive?

Fraternities are a small portion of your total college expenses. Fraternities are actually inexpensive when you consider aggregated savings on housing, food, parking, and scholarship opportunities. Rush Tips

1. Go to Recruitment Events at More than One Chapter

The best strategy for Recruitment is to explore all of your options. Visit all the chapters early in the week, narrow down your choices to the three or four that you like best, then concentrate on them during the rest of Recruitment.

2. Ask Intelligent Questions

More importantly, look for intelligent answers. Questions are one of the best ways to show your interest in the chapter and getting the answers ahead of time will save you any surprises down the road. Can I move into the house? How much are dues? What would be expected of me as a member?

3. Be Confident

One of the most important tips during Recruitment is to act confident. No one is truly one hundred percent confident, but the more self-assured you can appear to be, the better.

4. Don't Try to Be Something You Are Not

Pick the chapter that fits your personality. Don't worry, there is a chapter out there for everyone. Just be yourself!

5. Beware of Subtle Clues

Remember that Recruitment is a two-way street. You're looking for a chapter that fits your style, and they're looking for members that will fit theirs. If you're not getting a warm reception, then don't waste time your there.

6. Meet as Many Guys as You Can

Meet as many guys as you can, and don't hesitate to ask them to introduce you around. Be assertive and act confidently. Ask to meet the Recruitment chairmen and the officers. If they like you, they can have a lot of influence.

7. Be Available During Recruitment

Many chapters will send out flyers, invitations, and bids to you throughout recruitment week. Be sure that the fraternities you like have your phone number and room numbers. If you need to turn down an invitation to an event, be sure to call their Recruitment chairman, thank him, and maybe make plans for a different event.

8. Use Careful Consideration in Accepting a Bid

Remember that Recruitment is a limited time period. Your fraternity affiliation will last a lifetime. Keeping that in mind, don't make any rash decisions on accepting a bid. You don't need to feel pressured to accept a bid the moment it is offered. It won't be revoked while you check out other chapters. Don't always accept the first bid you receive. You'll probably get others, and they are all valid until the end of Recruitment, often times longer. Take your time and make the right choice!
